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A Look Back at 2023!

It is hard to believe that another year has flown by! 2023 was another successful year for Hemophilia of Indiana and the bleeding disorders community. The year started with one of our biggest fundraisers, the Hearts for Hemophilia Gala. The Gala was held in January at the Grand Hall at Union Station. Over 200 attendees enjoyed a fun evening while supporting Hemophilia of Indiana's programs and services. In March we headed to Washington DC to advocate on behalf of the bleeding disorders community across the country. In April, we had 13 teams participate in Bowling for Bleeding Disorders held at Pinheads in Fishers. Proceeds from the event directly support the Judy Moore Memorial Scholarship Program. The Unite for Bleeding Disorders Walk was moved to May in 2023 and was another successful event and surpassed our goal of \$40,000! The Course to a Cure Golf Outing was held in June and while enjoying almost perfect weather, over 100 golfers participated and supported Hemophilia of Indiana. Camp Brave Eagle was held the next week in June and while the weather was a little chillier than past years, it was another successful year of camp. The Doug Thompson Teen Leadership camp was held in July and the campers traveled to Potato Creek State Park. This year's campers enjoyed kayaking, fishing, cycling, and a ton of other activities. This year the camper also participated in a campus tour at the University of Notre Dame! The 2023 Annual Meeting was held in August at the Crowne Plaza Hotel. Over 200 attendees enjoyed a weekend of education and support from fellow members of the bleeding disorders community. Following the Annual Meeting, 25 members of Indiana's bleeding disorders community attended the National Bleeding Disorders Foundation's Bleeding Disorders Conference in National Harbor, Maryland. The final event of the year was the Year End Education Event held at the beginning of December. 
